
JOIN THE CITY FOR COASTAL CLEANUP SEPTEMBER 17

APPLY FOR THE PARKS & RECREATION COMMISSION

The City currently has one vacancy on the Parks and Recreation Commission.

The Parks and Recreation Commission is an advisory body to the City Council on matters pertaining to recreation and park facilities. Commissioners serve two-year terms, with a maximum of three consecutive terms. However, this vacancy would fill one unexpired term through June 30, 2023.

The Parks and Recreations Commission meets at 7:00 p.m. on the fourth Tuesday of every month. City residency is required. A stipend of \$75.00 per meeting attended is paid to each Commissioner.

Interested Dixon residents may obtain an application at City Hall, 600 East A Street, by calling 678-7000, or by visiting the City's website at www.cityofdixon.us. The deadline for filing applications is 5:00 p.m., Friday, September 9, 2022.



PROVIDE YOUR INPUT: DRAFT HOUSING ELEMENT

Did you know every City in California has a Housing Element that evaluates housing needs and how to meet those needs?

Housing Elements are required to be updated at least every eight years, in accordance with a statewide update cycle. The City currently has a certified Housing Element for 2015-2023. As the end of the 8 year cycle nears, the City has embarked on an update to prepare for the next Housing Element cycle, which will cover 2023 through 2031 and is required to be completed by January 31, 2023. This is the 6th Cycle Update.

The Draft Housing Element has been released for public review. Review the draft and submit your comments by Monday, September 12, 2022 at 5:00pm.

The Planning Commission and City Council will consider the draft Housing Element at their respective meetings on Tuesday, September 13, 2022 and Tuesday, September 20, 2022.
