NAMING DOWNTOWN PLAZA

The City is currently accepting name suggestions for the new Downtown Plaza! Email your suggestion to socialmedia@cityofdixon.us by July 31. Once suggestions have been received, City Council will conduct a community meeting to receive public input and select the plaza's name.



GRILLIN-N-CHILLIN IS BACK!

Grillin-n-Chillin is returning to Dixon Saturday, July 16. The event is open from 10:00am-10:00pm and will include a chili and rib cook off, street vendors, activities and demonstrations for kids in addition to live music and a car show.

The City works with Dixon Grillin-n-Chillin to divert traffic around downtown streets. The event will involve the closure of State Highway 113 (First Street) from C Street to Mayes, A Street from North Jackson to Second Street, North Jackson from West A Street to B Street and B Street from Jackson to Second Street, Second Street from A Street to C Street, and West Mayes from First Street to Jackson Street.

Roads will be closed from 5:30am on Saturday, July 16 until 1:00am Sunday, July 17.

4TH OF JULY FIREWORKS SHOW & ACTIVITES

The City of Dixon and the Rotary Club of Dixon are cohosting a Fourth of July fireworks show in Hall Park at 9:30pm!

In addition to the fireworks show, the following events will be taking place:

- The City will be hosting Recreation Swim at the Pat Granucci Aquatics Center (450 East Mayes Street, Dixon, CA) from 3pm-6pm. The entry price is \$5.75 per adult and \$4.00 for children and seniors.
- The City will be partnering with a local pickleball group to host open pickleball play and instruction from 4:30-5:30pm; round robin pickleball play from 5:30-7:30pm; and open pickleball play from 7:30-8:30pm. All pickleball events are free and open to players of all skill levels, including beginners.
- A food truck court will be in the parking lot of the Pat Granucci Aquatics Center (450 East Mayes Street, Dixon, CA) from 6:00pm-9:30pm.



FIREWORKS SAFETY

Celebrate 4th of July safely this year, and avoid fines for illegal fireworks. The Dixon Municipal Code allows for the sale of safe and sane fireworks from June 28th to July 4th and the possession, and use of safe and sane fireworks during a specified time from June 28th through July 6th of each calendar year.

Fireworks that explode, shoot through the air, move along the ground, including skyrockets, bottle rockets and firecrackers of all types are never permitted. A violation of the Fireworks Ordinance is punishable by the issuance of an administrative citation with an accompanying administrative fine up to \$1,000.




KEEP YOUR FAMILY SAFE IN AN EMERGENCY- REGISTER FOR COMMUNITY CONNECT

The Dixon Fire Department has been working closely with technology partner First Due to implement Community Connect, an application focused on protecting residents and their property in the most effective way possible during an incident or major disaster.

Community Connect is a secure, easy to use platform that allows residents to share critical information about their household in order to aid first responders and emergency service personnel to respond more efficiently and effectively; ultimately resulting in better incident outcomes.

In addition to the residential portal, Community Connect also helps business owners and property managers keep people at their commercial properties safe by giving First Responders access to critical documents such as evacuation procedures, occupant rosters, hazardous material lists and more.

REC SWIM SATURDAY JULY 16 & 30

There will be two Saturday Rec Swim sessions in July! Join us Saturday, July 16 and Saturday, July 30 to cool off!

The pool, located at 450 E. Mayes St., will also be open every Tuesday & Thursday from 1:00pm-4:00pm.

The cost is \$5.75 per visit for adults and \$4.00 per visit for children and seniors.

SUMMER LAP SWIM

The pool is open for lap swim to those aged 14+ Monday-Thursday from 5:30am-7:45am; 11:00am-12:45pm and 4:00-6:30pm. Weekend hours are Friday-Sunday 8:00am-10:00am.

The cost is \$5 per visit or \$75 for a 20 visit punch card. Senior pricing is \$4 per visit or \$60 for a 20 visit punch card.
